He gives me a blue ribbon.

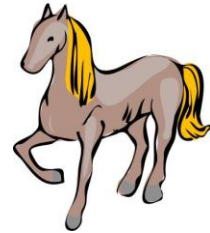
I am very excited. My dad gives me a hug.
