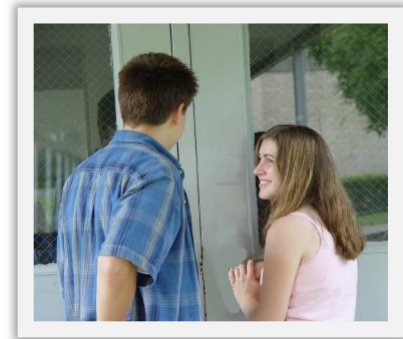
Horatio blinked his eyes. "But what about everything you just said?"
