1. Like in questions

appearance: Q2; personality: Q3; hobbies Q1. Make sure students are sure about how to use 'like' differently.

If you have a confident group of students, at this point you can also tell them that the question 'what is he/she like?' can be used for both appearance and personality, but it's usually used for personality. Example: He's short and funny. Remind them that 'look like' in questions is only for appearance.
